

Helge Rask-Andersen, M.D., Ph.D.

Uppsala University Hospital, Sweden

Helge Rask-Andersen is Professor of Otology at the Department of Otology, Uppsala University Hospital, Sweden. He directs the Uppsala cochlear implant and Audiotory Brainstem Implant team as well as the Uppsala Inner Ear Research Unit. He has a special interest in the treatment of inner ear disorders, especially cochlear implantation, skull-base surgery, and Ménière's disease. He is also a

cell biologist focusing on inner ear anatomy and physiology. Currently he is involved in the European



Commission Concerted Action on nanoparticle-targeted drug and gene delivery to the inner ear. He is on the editorial board of many international journals and has lectured and written extensively on inner ear anatomy and disease. He was a visiting Professor at Innsbruck University and a Research Consultant at the House Ear Institute in Los Angeles in 1988-1989. He was awarded the Franz Escher Medal in 2006

by the Swiss Society of Otolaryngology and The Gordon Smyth Medal 2007 by the British Society of Otolaryngology.







Program Description

This week long medical education program is intended for practicing otolaryngologists, otologists/neurotologists, neurologists/neurosurgeons, neuroradiologists and audiologists. It will provide a comprehensive overview of inner ear diseases/ disorders and their treatments. Basic and clinical researchers will present lectures and conduct plenary sessions on clinical ramifications of inner ear pathophysiology, state-of-the-art interventions, inner ear organ culture techniques, hair cell regeneration, inner ear fluid dynamics and their alterations in pathophysiologic disorders, and autoimmune inner ear disease.

Purposes/Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- have a comprehensive understanding of the pathophysiology of inner ear disorders
- identify and discuss appropriate medical and/or surgical treatment regimens for Ménière's disease and other diseases of the inner ear, including tinnitus
- assess the indications and basic interpretations of diagnostic findings for vertiginous patients
- discuss culture techniques for hair cell regeneration and tissue engineering
- have a comprehensive overview of implantable hearing devices and cochlear implants
- understand inner ear fluid dynamics and homeostasis in the normal and hydropic inner ear
- discuss diagnostic and intraoperative monitoring of the inner ear
